Located in a wooded suburban setting on 70 acres in western Montgomery County, PA, Eagleville provides a serene, therapeutic atmosphere that encourages rehabilitation. The only hospital in Pennsylvania specifically and solely licensed for the treatment of alcohol and drug addiction as well as co-existing disorders, Eagleville is committed to helping its patients recover from the pain of addiction while rebuilding their lives.

Riverside Care provides a full continuum of community-based treatment programs for alcohol and drug dependent men, women and adolescents. Committed to serving the needs of the community, Riverside Care has developed specialized programs to address the various stages of the recovery process. Eagleville Hospital's Planned Giving program has been the recipient of several bequests. One such bequest for a specific purpose was made by Mrs. Anne S. Price.

Mrs. Price gave 28 years of dedicated service to Eagleville Hospital as a Member of the Board of Directors. She was President of the Board of Directors of Eagleville Hospital from 1977 to 1981. Under her leadership the Education Program was expanded. Under her guidance, the Women's Inpatient Program received attention in the areas of therapy and education seminars designed to address women's needs in the areas of financial planning, assertiveness, parenting, nutrition, and physical exercise. Alcoholics Anonymous, Al-Anon and Narcotics Anonymous self-help meetings were initiated on the grounds and later, a Cocaine Anonymous group was formed.

Energetic fund raising efforts led by Mrs. Price yielded over one million dollars for construction of the Levy, D'Arclay and Price Buildings, which were completed in 1981. Mrs. Price showed a particular interest in helping adolescents, a fact evidenced by her leaving a substantial contribution to Eagleville in her estate as a matching donation challenge to initiate a program specific to adolescents special needs.

Eagleville Hospital's oldest named fund is **The Jim Shapiro Memorial Fund.**

Jim Shapiro was a very active and dedicated member of the Eagleville Hospital Board of Directors from 1970 until 1982. During his lifetime, Jim gave generously to support the mission of Eagleville. The Eagleville Education program was very special to Jim.

The patients we serve range from those who have little or no education to others who have not used their educational background to their own advantage. Through the Eagleville Education program, licensed teachers offer adult basic education programs and help patients to develop literacy skills. Patients with academic skills and volunteers act as tutors under the direction of the teachers.

The education program is extremely effective in helping patients to re-direct their lives in a productive direction. Since 1985, more than 550 patients have passed their GED exam while in residence at Eagleville. Each year nearly 1,500 patients benefit from the education program.

A portion of the program's cost is supported by the annual gifts from individuals giving to **The Jim Shapiro Memorial Fund.**



**Jim Shapiro's** legacy of commitment continues today through the efforts of his wife, Marion Shapiro, Psy.D. and his son, Jon A. Shapiro, M.D., both members of the Eagleville Hospital Board of Directors. In addition, Jim's oldest son, Michael Shapiro and daughter, Susan Siegel, are strongly committed to **The Jim Shapiro Memorial Fund** which was established by his family.

Since Jim's death in 1982, Shapiro family members and friends have contributed more than \$100,000 in support of the Eagleville Education Program.
